



## Terms of Reference CSPCP Awards

### The Eduardo Bruera Award in Palliative Medicine

#### Summary

This award is given annually to a physician who demonstrates excellence in the field of Palliative Medicine as recognized by his or her peers. It honours the achievements of Dr. Eduardo Bruera, an internationally recognized palliative care physician and researcher. The Award is graciously donated by the Division of Palliative Care Medicine at the University of Alberta to celebrate the legacy of Dr. Bruera during his tenure as Director of their Palliative Care program, with matching funds from the Canadian Society of Palliative Care Physicians (CSPCP).

Recognizing	Physicians who have made a difference at a local/regional level, demonstrating a commitment to excellence in palliative medicine in any of the following areas: clinical palliative medicine, education, research, program administration, or international involvement in palliative medicine. Could be mid-career.
Eligibility	Current member of the CSPCP who has practiced palliative medicine for 3 years or more. Still working/not retired. <i>Exclusions:</i> Current members of the CSPCP Board and members of the judging committee are not eligible to be nominated.
Nominated by	Two peers. At least one must be a CSPCP member. Nominators cannot be on the judging committee.
Judging Committee	The CSPCP Awards Committee plus a representative from the University of Alberta.
Recognition	Presentation at awards event at the annual CSPCP Advanced Learning in Palliative Medicine Conference, by a representative of the University of Alberta and the President of the CSPCP.
Prize	Economy travel, accommodation, local transportation, and meals to attend the awards ceremony in accordance with CSPCP travel policy. One year membership in the CSPCP. Commemorative plaque.
